TERMS OF REFERENCE FOR THE ACQUISITION OF EXPERTISE TO ASSIST WITH FACILITATING STRATEGY SESSIONS FOR (A) THE IDT MANAGEMENT TEAM AND (B) THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES.

# 1. Background

The IDT is a programme management and implementing agent of the Department of Public Works and Infrastructure and is listed as a Schedule 2 Major Public Entity in terms of the Public Finance Management Act (PFM). Its primary mandate is to manage the delivery of social infrastructure on behalf of all spheres of government. The IDT is funded through management fees which it charges its client departments and is not funded through a government grant. Any fiscal transfers or grants made to the entity by the national government are for a specific purpose and not aimed at sustaining its operations.

The IDT's current strategy is anchored on the following three pillars.

- Build an Organisational Capability Fit for Purpose.
- Refocus and Streamline client service offering.
- Secure the entity's financial Sustainability.

In July 2021, a new IDT Board of Trustees came into office following a long period of uncertainty about the entity's future. The new Board of Trustees had a mandate to reconfigure the IDT into a financially viable and stable entity. A major outcome of this process was a business case that argued that there is still a need for the IDT to continue to exist as it plays a critical role in the delivery of social infrastructure. Once approved by the relevant authorities, including Cabinet, the reconfiguration process will be able to confirm a suitable legal form for the IDT in terms of the Public Finance Management Act, (PFMA) as recommended by the business case.

# 2. Discussion/ Motivation.

The five-year term of the sixth administration (2019-2024) has come to an end and the seventh administration has taken office for another five-year term. The new administration is in the process of setting its priorities for the five-year Medium Term Strategic Framework (MTSF). As a result, government departments and entities have to review their current priorities to ensure that they are in line with the goals of the new government. As part of this exercise, the IDT intends to review its performance over the 2020-2025 MTSF and set a new agenda for the 2025-2029 MTSF. The exercise will also include a review of the entity's strategic intent, mission, vision, and values to determine if they are still relevant, and set new ones in case the current ones need to be changed.

Of particular interest to the board is how best to position the IDT to remain relevant and deliver its services more effectively. The IDT Board and Management recognise that the entity is in the recovery phase; transitioning from programme portfolio performance decline to portfolio growth and a need for accelerated delivery to sustain itself financially and remain relevant to the shareholder and its stakeholder. It is in this context that the Board of Trustees seeks to engage the services of an experienced expert to facilitate

two strategy sessions: one for Management, and another one for the Board of Trustees (Board strategy will also include Management).

# 3. Scope of Work and Deliverables

To facilitate two strategy sessions. The first one will be for IDT management which will serve as a precursor to the Board strategy session. The first session, for management, will be held on 12-13 September 2024, while the second session, the Board session, will be held on 19-20 September 2024. The management session will be used as a preparatory session for the board strategy session. Accordingly, the entity intends to appoint one service provider for both sessions. This will ensure that there is synergy between the two strategy sessions.

The objectives of both sessions are to:

- Assess the IDT's performance since the beginning of the current Medium Term Strategic Framework which started with the 6<sup>th</sup> Administration in 2020.
- Review the entity's, mission, vision, values, and strategic pillars to determine if they are still relevant.
- Develop a five-year strategic plan and a new (2025/26) corporate plan that is aligned with the priorities of the seventh administration.

Deliverables/ Outcomes: A 2025/26 – 2029/30 Strategic Plan and a 2025/26 Corporate Plan/ (2025/26 Annual Performance Plan) including a detailed plan on how the entity will deliver on its targets for the 2025/26 financial year

  - the 90/10 system for requirements with a Rand value above R50 000 000 (all applicable taxes included).

# 1.2 To be completed by the organ of state

The applicable preference point system for this tender is the 80/20 preference point system.

- a) 80/20 preference point system will be applicable in this tender. The lowest/ highest acceptable tender will be used to determine the accurate system once tenders are received.
- 1.3 Points for this tender (even in the case of a tender for income-generating contracts) shall be awarded for:
  - (a) Price; and
  - (b) Specific Goals.

- 1.5 Failure on the part of a tenderer to submit proof or documentation required in terms of this tender to claim points for specific goals with the tender, will be interpreted to mean that preference points for specific goals are not claimed.
- 1.6 The organ of state reserves the right to require of a tenderer, either before a tender is adjudicated or at any time subsequently, to substantiate any claim in regard to preferences, in any manner required by the organ of state.

#### 2. **DEFINITIONS**

- (a) "tender" means a written offer in the form determined by an organ of state in response to an
  invitation to provide goods or services through price quotations, competitive tendering process or
  any other method envisaged in legislation;
- (b) "price" means an amount of money tendered for goods or services, and includes all applicable taxes less all unconditional discounts;
- (c) "rand value" means the total estimated value of a contract in Rand, calculated at the time of bid invitation, and includes all applicable taxes;
- (d) "tender for income-generating contracts" means a written offer in the form determined by an organ of state in response to an invitation for the origination of income-generating contracts through any method envisaged in legislation that will result in a legal agreement between the organ of state and a third party that produces revenue for the organ of state, and includes, but is not limited to, leasing and disposal of assets and concession contracts, excluding direct sales and disposal of assets through public auctions; and
- (e) "the Act" means the Preferential Procurement Policy Framework Act, 2000 (Act No. 5 of 2000).

#### 4. POINTS AWARDED FOR SPECIFIC GOALS

4.1. In terms of Regulation 4(2); 5(2); 6(2) and 7(2) of the Preferential Procurement Regulations, preference points must be awarded for specific goals stated in the tender. For the purposes of this tender the tenderer will be allocated points based on the goals stated in table 1 below as may be supported by proof/ documentation stated in the conditions of this tender:

- 4.2. In cases where organs of state intend to use Regulation 3(2) of the Regulations, which states that, if it is unclear whether the 80/20 or 90/10 preference point system applies, an organ of state must, in the tender documents, stipulate in the case of—
