Supply Chain Management

IDT has an SCM Policy which is aligned to legislation and regulation as published by the National Treasury. It has Supply Chain Management Procedures which are in place for guiding its procurement activities.

Delegations of Authority in place Tenders are processed through the following committee systems:

- Bid Specification Committee
- Tender Evaluation Committee
- Bid Adjudication Committees

The SCM system is audited internally and externally for compliance.

Advertising of Bids

Tenders are advertised on the CIDB i-Tender website for construction related bids. Tenders are also advertised in the IDT website (www.idt.org.za), the e-Tender Portal Tenders are also advertised in regional newspapers in different provinces where projects are located. Potential bidders are encouraged to visit the above mentioned websites to view any advertised Tenders and Request for Quotation.



Vendor and Supplier Management

The IDT as a Schedule 2 under PFMA is a state-owned entity. The entity uses the Central Supplier Database (Link to CSD) as per directive from the National Treasury. All interested and potential suppliers must meet all the compliance requirements according to the Central Supplier Database of the National Treasury.

The IDT has a vendor management system wherein all interested and potential suppliers may register as potential suppliers. Suppliers have to comply with minimum registration criteria before being listed on the vendor management system as an accredited supplier. Application forms are available online and at IDT offices. **SCM uses CSD for procuring through a quotation process, VMS is only used as a tool to link supplier to the payment system. VMS is no longer accepted as a database for the IDT since the inception of CSD**

Empowerment

The IDT is committed to the empowerment of its suppliers and complies to the Broad Based Black Economic Empowerment Act and Preferential Procurement Regulations. Established SMME's and firms owned by women, youth and disabled persons are encouraged to apply as vendors. **BBBEE has been repealed, the IDT has as guided by the PPPFA, 2022 has institutionalized Specific Goals for empowerment.**
